IN THE NEWS

O'Dowd Tops Other Schools in UC Admittance Rates

A recent article from the *San Francisco Chronicle* reported that students from O'Dowd's Class of 2022 achieved an impressive 76% acceptance rate to campuses across the University of California, surpassing neighboring East Bay Catholic and Independent high schools. This accomplishment follows the current *U.S. News and World Report*, where the University of California system rose significantly in the ranks based on "social mobility," which is measured through graduation rates for low-income students as well as for first-generation college students.

O'Dowd's AP African American Studies Pilot Featured on Both PBS News Hour and KQED Forum

O'Dowd was one of 60 U.S. high schools piloting the new Advanced Placement African American Studies course, which is now being taught in over 700 schools across the country. Veteran Social Studies teacher Tony Green developed and has been teaching a similar course at O'Dowd for over 30 years. Both *PBS News Hour* and *KQED Forum* recently ran feature stories showcasing our students studying African American history in the classroom, with topics including the diaspora and the accomplishments of African Americans. We are also proud to note that Tony Green was the only high school teacher invited by Dr. Brandi Waters, Executive Director of AP African American Studies for the College Board, to present at the Association for the Study of the Worldwide African Diaspora's Biennial Conference in Ghana.

O'Dowd Art Teachers Receive Rave Reviews for Recent Publications

Faculty members Briana Loewinsohn and Thien Pham have each released graphic memoirs that focus on their personal experiences with family. Loewinsohn's *Ephemera* beautifully captures a delicate mother-daughter relationship, and has been positively reviewed by NPR, *Publishers Weekly*, and was even included on a *NY Times* list. Pham's *Family Style* is about a Vietnamese immigrant boy's search for belonging in America, and has been reviewed by *The Comics Journal*, *The San Francisco Chronicle*, and KQED.



MARY OPPEDAHL '64: FINDING HER PLACE IN THE WORLD

In describing **Mary Oppedahl '64**, the word “intrepid” comes to mind. Since graduating from O’Dowd, she’s not only forged a distinguished legal career—as a civil litigator in areas like product liability—but her travels have taken her to every corner of the globe, visiting all seven continents.

“I loved Antarctica because it’s so otherworldly,” she says. “But I also enjoyed Africa and Greenland—and Iceland is definitely up there, too.” She plans to see Turkey in the fall and already has four trips planned for 2024.

Oppedahl’s successful legal career has enabled her to give back to her alma mater, making O’Dowd a beneficiary of her retirement plan. Such strategic thinking has been a hallmark of her educational and professional path.

After O’Dowd, Mary attended Holy Names College, then spent six years running a program for troubled youth in East Oakland. She taught high school psychology for a year while she saved up for graduate school, earning her master’s degree in social work at St. Louis University. “My education at O’Dowd instilled a strong calling to give back to the world,” she says. She went on to take a job with the Alameda County Healthcare Services Agency, in the drug and alcohol abuse department.

“I’m still grateful for O’Dowd’s rigorous and well-rounded curriculum,” Mary declares. “It gave me the foundational skills in critical thinking, strong writing, a robust work ethic, and the ability to speak to a group—all of which ultimately enabled me to become an attorney.” Working fulltime and attending night classes, Mary earned a law degree from the University of San Francisco at the age of 37. Her 30-year legal career ended in 2015, when she retired from the San Francisco firm Reed Smith. “It’s wonderful how a school like O’Dowd supports



students to continue searching for their place in the world,” Mary says. “That’s the attitude that helped me end up where I belonged.”

Now, Mary is able to return the favor. By contributing to her retirement plan and making O’Dowd her beneficiary, Mary’s able to make an impact at O’Dowd and reduce the tax burden on her estate. “The formidable Sister Xavier Mary made sure I knew how to write a proper term paper, and it served me well,” Mary jokes. “Now I can show my gratitude to O’Dowd for future students.”

BUILDING A WORLD OF PEACE AND JUSTICE

STUDENT PROJECTS ADDRESS POVERTY, FOOD INSECURITY, DISABILITY RIGHTS, AND STEM

At O’Dowd, every student is challenged to ask themselves:

“What kind of person do I want to be? What am I created to do?”

Their Anawim Project — a 60+ hour service commitment — helps them to answer.

Completed alongside our required Peace and Justice course, the Anawim Project challenges 11th and 12th grade students to work with local communities for justice.

“Our Peace and Justice course covers a range of important subjects, from environmental justice, economic justice, housing justice, racial justice, and more,” explains Molleen Dupree-Dominguez, Chair of the Religious Studies Department. “The Anawim Project is a chance for students to continue diving deep into Catholic social teaching, to deeply synthesize the principles of our Charism, and to apply what they’ve learned to real life work.” She smiles. “I’ve seen many students ignite a commitment for an issue or a community that they carry forward into their adult lives.”

Social justice is central to O’Dowd’s mission, which is why every student graduates having completed at least 100 hours of service learning. “We want our students to see the interconnectedness of all beings,” Molleen says. “We want them to understand how issues are linked together, and how we can impact systems in positive ways. We put a high priority on partnering with service agencies, reaching out beyond the borders of our campus, and having profound social justice learning experiences for students.”

Service Learning at O’Dowd

Combining academic study with community need, students progress through four years of development projects, connecting with marginalized people while also recognizing, analyzing, and responding to social justice issues.



9TH GRADE
Common Home Project (10 HOURS)

With a focus on our Charism of *kinship with creation*, students serve 10 hours at Bay Area organizations committed to integral ecology and environmental justice. While learning how environmental degradation disproportionately affects marginalized communities, students practice the Judeo-Christian call to environmental stewardship.



10TH GRADE
Friends Project (25 HOURS)

In tandem with Christian Scriptures, students put their leadership skills into practice by building mentoring relationships with children ages 4–12. Partnering with a local organization, students serve 25 hours practicing personal leadership, initiative, and independent work skills through the joy of mentoring a young person.



11TH/12TH GRADE
Anawim Project (60 HOURS)

Completed in tandem with O’Dowd’s Peace and Justice course, The Anawim Project challenges students to connect with people who experience the injustice of marginalization. Over a 60-hour service learning commitment, students stretch beyond charity, working with local communities for justice.

When Ariana saw the opportunity to teach science to 2nd-4th grade kids at Harbor House in Oakland's San Antonio neighborhood, she was stoked. "I have epilepsy, which originally got me interested in neuroscience," Ariana shares. "And I wanted to take my passion for science to the young kids at Harbor House, many of whom don't get a lot of enrichment activities."

Ariana dug in, developing fun and artistic lesson plans that got her students learning about chemistry, biology, and ecology. "Seeing how enthusiastic the kids were, it made me really excited to keep teaching," Ariana says. But it was upsetting, too. She learned from her Harbor House supervisor that many of the students she was teaching came from families locked in intergenerational cycles of poverty. "It made me really aware of my privilege," Ariana says. "It also showed me how important education is. How important it is to see a different path for yourself, even if your parents didn't get to go to college."

Now Ariana is moving forward with new dedication to her life path. "I saw at Harbor House how important mental health is. It made me realize that giving young people support during this key developmental time in their lives is a total gamechanger," she asserts. "Now I want to become a psychiatrist and serve young people in under-resourced communities."

It all started for London when he watched a video about the "Gangsta Gardener" in Los Angeles. "South Central LA is a food desert, which means there is a lack of healthy food everywhere," London says. "This 'Gangsta Gardener' decided to make a difference by planting food in his own front yard, and then he started branching out to more land. I thought that was really interesting!"

For his Anawim Project, London started volunteering at the UC Gill Tract Community Farm in Albany, which offers harvested food to families in exchange for help weeding, planting, and watering. The experience was eye opening. "I saw how many people in the East Bay are struggling with homelessness, poverty, lack of transportation, and just isolation," London describes. "But I also saw a lot of human goodness. I saw how much passion there is in the local community to not only provide nutritious food to people who need it, but to also give respect and dignity to everyone, too."

The experience made London hungry for more. "I might want to be an environmental scientist," he says. "I learned from urban farming how important community is and how much more we can achieve when we work together. Now I want to keep teaching people to plant their own gardens, so they don't have to rely on the Dollar Store or liquor stores for food, and they can feel proud of what they grew for themselves."

"If your child is born with a disability, life is so much more complicated," Maya reflects. "My aunt had a brain tumor as a young child and it affected her development. So working with people who have special needs is important to me."

For Maya's Anawim Project she volunteered with the SPCA, supporting elementary school children with autism, OCD and ADHD to interact with animals. "Being able to play with dogs and cats helped them to socialize with each other, and see where they have common interests," Maya explains.

The project got Maya thinking more broadly about inclusivity. "Working with these kids on a regular basis made me aware of how frustrating it is when systems don't support your needs," Maya says. "It gave me passion to make sure that the right supports are available in mainstream classrooms, so that all kids are getting what they need to participate and be included."

Maya wants to go to medical school, maybe to become a veterinarian. Her Anawim Project is a building block on her path, giving her more appreciation for the different experiences each person brings to a relationship, situation or environment. "The kids' disabilities influenced the way they thought, and how they saw the world," Maya shares. "It gave me the skills to better understand what another person is going through."

Ethan is fluent in four computer programming languages. But it was

through his older sister **Abby Gonzalez '21**, who is studying environmental science at Brown University, that he learned how great the disparity is between men and women pursuing careers in STEM fields. "My goal is to bring STEM education opportunities to underrepresented communities," he says.

Ethan did his Anawim Project with Girls Inc. in Alameda, teaching computer science classes to groups of 3rd-4th grade girls from different socioeconomic backgrounds. "I want to show them that coding is fun and rewarding, but also feasible," Ethan describes. "I want the girls to see that they could have a future in technology."

Pretty quickly, Ethan learned what challenges the girls were facing. "My supervisor shared that many of the students were impacted by bullying and struggled with body image issues and low self-esteem," he reports. "So I focused on making sure that my classroom was a safe, positive place. I want the girls to feel empowered in what they can DO and not feel that their power is dictated by external appearances. I want them to be proud of solving difficult problems, and to build confidence in their skills and abilities." He pauses. "Working with these girls brings back memories of how my sister felt intimidated as a young woman participating in a male-dominated field," Ethan remembers.

Ethan completes his Anawim Project having learned not just how to be a better teacher, but also the power of empathy. "I'm passionate about using knowledge to make positive change," he shares. "My project showed me how to bring more love and kindness into teaching. I really hope that the girls I work with gain a spark for coding and go on to join more women in STEM fields!"

Thus the 201 Club was born, recognizing the extraordinary dedication of students who have gone above and beyond, giving over 200 hours to their Anawim Project. In the last 15 years, roughly 600 students have taken their place in the 201 Club, and we know many more will follow in the years to come.

Reunion Day provides an opportunity for classes to come together to create new memories on campus and see the growth of the school. Class Endowment Funds support the Tuition Assistance program which provides a financial bridge to over 350 students each year.

Thirteen alumni classes have started a Class Endowment to support today's students. These endowments hold over \$1.5 million which will continue to grow and distribute funds every year in perpetuity.

The Class of 1962 Scholarship Fund was spearheaded by the class in 2014 and has grown from \$35,000 in the first year to just over \$135,000 today. "I was touched by the stories of young people who needed help getting over the hurdle of tuition costs," said Wes Smith '62.



TUITION ASSISTANCE

Through generous donors, O'Dowd is able to invest more than \$4 million in financial aid annually—with individual awards ranging from about \$2,760 to \$21,760. This provides access and opportunity to students who receive aid and also enriches the experience for all students by making O'Dowd a socio-economically diverse campus.

BREAKING BARRIERS: CHANGING THE FACE OF LACROSSE



Mariah Branscomb '23 grew up in a sports family. Her father, Kenyan Branscomb, coached football at O'Dowd from 2014-2021, and her two brothers, **Kenyan Branscomb Jr. '18** and **Kaleb Branscomb '21**, played on the football team. In elementary and middle school, Mariah excelled at basketball and soccer. But over time she grew disillusioned with sports. "It felt like everyone was competing against each other to be the best, and the fun of just being a team was lost," she remembers.

Then Mariah started at O'Dowd and learned that she had to fulfill two semesters of Physical Education. That, or play a sport. "I picked lacrosse because it was no-cut," Mariah jokes. "I figured it would be an easy way to get those PE credits taken care of."

Mariah didn't count on her own athleticism. Once she was on the lacrosse field, her talent took over. Soon she was starting every game, and quickly advanced to varsity. She loved playing midfield and going on the attack, running down the field to score.

"The problem was, there weren't very many girls of color on the lacrosse team," Mariah says, sighing. It got her wheels turning, because by now, Mariah loved the game.

She figured there were other girls of color who would enjoy lacrosse but didn't see it as a sport "for them." "Lacrosse is really fun to play, and it's really cool to watch," Mariah declares. "And O'Dowd is SUCH a diverse and inclusive school, so our lacrosse team should reflect that."

The desire to make sure everyone feels welcome runs deep in Mariah, way before lacrosse or even athletics. "My younger sister has special needs," Mariah shares. "I was always her protector. We'd go to school together and I'd eat lunch with her. She struggles to communicate and I was there to help her. It taught me to look out for others. It taught me to see the people on the sidelines and to make space for them to participate."

That's why it wasn't enough for Mariah to have found a sport that she loved. She wanted to make sure that other girls of color at O'Dowd felt like lacrosse could belong to them, too. "After growing up in Pleasanton, which is a predominantly white suburb, coming to O'Dowd felt like coming home," Mariah says. "Being surrounded by so many different cultures and identities gave me the room to feel really supported and seen and comfortable. I know how important that is. That's what I wanted to bring to our lacrosse team."

So even though she had completed her PE credits and could have walked away, Mariah instead became the team captain. She started her junior year with a mission to recruit girls of color. “My friends were definitely looking at me sideways,” she exclaims, laughing. “Like, lacrosse?! Isn’t that a preppy thing?! And I was like, trust me, it’s going to be fun!”

Mariah put in the work and she succeeded. O’Dowd’s Girls Lacrosse team is now 70% players of color. And as captain, Mariah made it her goal to get everyone tightly bonded. “Chemistry on the field comes from chemistry off the field,” explains Mariah, demonstrating the years of sports wisdom she carries. So in addition to running drills, Mariah focused on strengthening the relationships between players. And steadily they rose in the ranks, becoming back-to-back champions of the WACC League in both 2022 and 2023. “That’s the first time O’Dowd has ever taken that title twice in a row!” Mariah crows proudly. “Girls Lacrosse had only won one league championship before.” With Mariah as team captain they went on to beat longtime rival Piedmont, in both the regular season and the WACC League Championship game.

“I’m just drawn to entering spaces where I’m a minority, and helping to create a path for others to follow.” Mariah says. She did the same thing with O’Dowd’s Mathletes—the student club for competitive mathematics. “That club was mostly boys, to be honest,” Mariah says. “And it was also, like, nerdy.” Mariah and two of her cheerleader friends, both African-American, became co-presidents. Together they made Mathletes cool, increasing the membership from 12 students to 72. But that’s a story for a different day. Suffice it to say, Mariah is a leader.

Mariah started at UC Berkeley this fall, where she hopes to major in business administration. Without a doubt, she’ll lead lasting change on her new campus, and in the world. Which is what O’Dowd Dragons do. Her legacy at O’Dowd lives on as more and more students of color decide to pursue not just lacrosse, but all kinds of activities where they may not have seen themselves previously represented. “It’s important for people of color to take up space in areas where we haven’t historically been allowed or invited,” she asserts. Thanks for helping to pave the way, Mariah. Let’s go, Dragons!

RAISING THE NEXT GENERATION OF EXCEPTIONAL DRAGONS

When **Amelia Allen '23** spoke as valedictorian at O'Dowd's June commencement ceremony, her parents, **Miller Allen '89** and **Tracy Allen '93**, were justifiably proud.

Amelia—who achieved a 4.4 GPA and held leadership roles on the Debate Team, the Black Student Union (BSU), and the Gender Justice Club—plans to major in biomedical engineering at Brown University. But the Allens' Dragon pride was compounded by the fact that they're both O'Dowd alumni themselves, and their son, **Mason '26**, is now a 10th grader.

The couple's own O'Dowd educations have served them well: Miller is senior director of process engineering at Applied Materials in Santa Clara and Tracy is senior software development manager at IBM in San Jose. They first crossed paths at a conference of the National Society of Black Engineers in Los Angeles while Tracy was an undergrad at San Francisco State University and Miller was pursuing his Ph.D. at UC Berkeley.

Because his classes at O'Dowd were so rigorous, Miller was able to skip many introductory courses in his freshman year of college; allowing him to TA and tutor, which

eased both his academic and financial burdens. Tracy credits O'Dowd with introducing her to computers and programming—the profession she eventually pursued. She also appreciates the critical-thinking, problem-solving, and analytical skills she learned not only in her STEM classes, but in her English courses as well.

That said, it wasn't assumed that Amelia would attend O'Dowd; the Allens wanted her to explore every option and make her own decision. When she was accepted to all three of the private schools she'd applied to, they assumed she'd choose a smaller one. Instead, Amelia presented a list of ten reasons why O'Dowd was the best fit. "She wanted to have a full high school experience, not just focus on college-prep academics," Tracy says.

Each parent had a very different experience at O'Dowd. Miller, already advanced in math, loved the computer lab—an unusual feature for high schools in the '80s. He's also grateful that faculty encouraged him to seek outside experiences, such as a NASA internship program that his physics teacher advised him to apply for.

Tracy, however, felt inadequately prepared by her middle school and found the transition to O'Dowd's math classes challenging. She went to the vice principal with her concerns, and he invited her to come early to school, where he tutored her himself. "That support has always stuck with me," she says.

Their children are receiving that same level of support, by teachers who encourage them to stay challenged and reach their full potential. In the 9th grade, Amelia's science teacher planted the seed for her to try AP Biology. "That put her on the path to explore the biomedical sciences," Tracy says. "And then she looked for college programs that were complementary to that." Now Amelia's pursuing biomedicine at Brown.

As for parents of new O'Dowd students, the Allens offer some simple advice. "First, think of the school as a village," Tracy says. "Everyone's here to help your children grow during this key period in their young lives. Second, don't come with a script—you just need to be a partner to them in their personal journey."

The Cor Unum Award, named for the school's motto, "One Heart in Christ," is Bishop O'Dowd High School's Highest Honor. It is presented each year to select members of the O'Dowd community, whose lives and work embody our mission to create a more just, joyful and sustainable world.

"On a basic level, education is key to life and key to success," says Tracey Borst, parent to **Natalie Menicucci '15**.

"An O'Dowd education is special, because on top of stellar academics and athletics, O'Dowd gives students a powerful foundation in values and spirituality. That's the kind of education that not only helps our kids to grow as people, but prepares them to make a difference in the world."

Tracey grew up Catholic and was drawn to the feminist movement from a young age. As a corporate executive, she stood for equality in the workplace. "Once you get connected to one piece of injustice, you see how it's tied to another," Tracey notes. "That's what I appreciate about O'Dowd. Justice is woven throughout the curriculum. Students are challenged to have conversations that aren't easy, and to look at the actions they can take. It's so important that our students learn all the ways that environmental, socioeconomic, racial, and gender justice issues are linked."

As a leader, Tracey has given her best to the school. She gave generously to help build the Center for Environmental Studies, then joined

the Board in 2014, serving on the Executive Committee, chairing the Development Committee, and co-chairing the Governance Committee, always bringing a deep sense of mission and purpose, along with joy and laughter, to every meeting.

Though Natalie graduated in 2015, Tracey has remained committed to O'Dowd, helping to lead the campaign to build our new Bishop John S. Cummins Center, and donating annually to tuition assistance. "Giving to education has the biggest payoff," Tracey asserts. "Especially at O'Dowd. It's so clear that everyone in the student body benefits from what an exceptional place this is. The diversity of the student body, on all levels, lifts everybody on campus to become a better version of themselves."

Tracey and her leadership have been a tremendous asset to O'Dowd. Her love for the school has inspired fellow parents, alumni, board members, and parents of alumni to invest in the legacy of O'Dowd, and with the Cor Unum Award we show utmost gratitude for how Tracey has strengthened O'Dowd for future generations.
